FORMAL LIVING-DINING

Double-height ceiling with glass walls along the length of the floor fills it with natural light. All furniture is upholstered in white leather and complemented with glass tables and table lamps. The side tables are bent glass placed over a marble block on castor, for ease of movement. Get the look For large size porcelain pieces check out Lladro. Try Rosenthal and Villeroy & Boch for plates, glassware and fine cutlery. Lalique and Klove Studio have clear glass lamps.



HOME PROFILE

THE PROPERTY Top five floors of Della Towers, a luxury residential tower in the Parel neighbourhood of Dadar, Mumbai. The first level is the foyer, entrance and a small home office. On the second level are the private rooms for the family; the third level has the family area and the kitchen, while the fourth and fifth floors are for formal entertaining, with a terrace lawn and a rooftop pool.

Designing for oneself comes with a great sense of freedom, especially when you have done enough work for others, built their homes and buildings,' says Jimmy Mistry, a self-taught designer who hasn't stopped learning since the time he dropped out of college. 'It's a different thing that I am obsessive about processes, which might appear to run counter to the liberal creative mindset usually associated with designers, but it has worked very well for me and my company. That is how we have been able to scale up,' tells Jimmy in a candid chat. After executing huge projects like the UB City in Bengaluru, when it came to his own home, scaling would surely have been an issue, we quiz. 'Besides, having "all that a home needs" for us as a family, I wanted it to be logistically stocked enough to host our extended family for special occasions and festivals. At the same time we wanted all the areas demarcated very clearly; not exactly a challenge when the house is on five levels. The formal living and dining areas are located at the top level with a huge terrace lawn and a rooftop pool. The family area is one complete floor with recreational, TV and chill out zones and a bar. The main kitchen is also on this level. All bedrooms and private areas make another floor, all connected with a capsule lift.

Occupying the top five floors of Della Towers, 'our home is a reflection of who we are. We travel a lot and like to bring back interesting pieces. Once they find their place around the house, they don't remain objects but become a part of memories!' Interestingly thus, the colour palette all across is shades of white and a lot of clear glass, which keeps the line of vision clear for the heroes to pop up. Flooded with natural light, and with sheers blurring away city skyline,



FORMAL AREA BAR

Fond of all things nice, the dramatic volume does well to host Jimmy's collection of XL pieces, such as the 'Visionnaire Horse lamp and the chandeliers. In the formal bar, it's the bottles that are collected for their design that jostle with each other while the regulars are stored away.

the drama created by the double-height ceiling adds immensely to the experience in the formal living area. Talking of scale, 'I wanted to be able to entertain upto 200 people during festivals. Hence the storage for all logistics also needed to be built-in.'

Jimmy's first experience in designing for himself came when he decided to develop the Della Adventure Park in Lonavala in

2009, which is when he felt the first rush of freedom. 'I changed the format of rooms and broke away from a typical resort. Even now when I travel, I am on the look-out for new things and products as small as door hinges and stoppers.' Office and home are in the same building and that keeps the family closer. 'The children are growing up and getting involved in office work. Hence our family time and work time are getting more and more synonymous. Typically, I keep the morning for myself, it's my strategy time. Work starts at 2 pm and goes on till 2:30 in the morning. I don't use emails at all and prefer to talk and keep the human connect. Don't get me wrong, I do spend 5-6 hours every week on software development for our company processes but in my personal space I prefer the human voice!' says Jimmy as he gets ready for another mega-project that's in the pipeline.

TV CORNER

A clean open area leaves you free to fill the space with activities and fun. The colour palette is neutral and furniture has simple, straight lines. 'Most of our time is spent in this area,' tells Delna. Get the look The ceiling lights are from Visionnaire Ona has clear lamps. Visit Natuzzi for white leather furniture.

↑ STUDY AREA

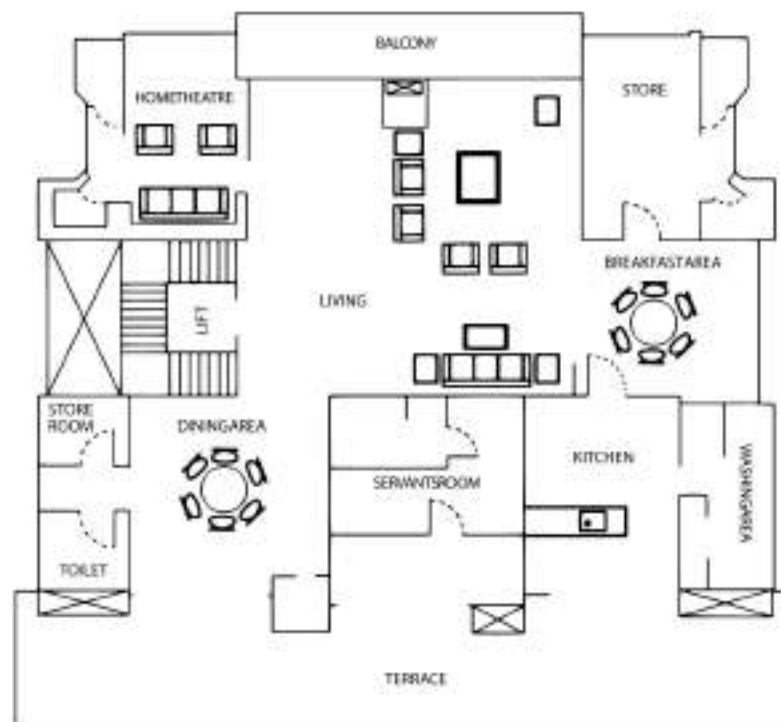
